

VOSSLOH SOUTH AMERICA IN LATINRIELES

Buenos Aires, Argentina

June 15 - 17, 2011

Vossloh South America participated in the 6th Congress of industrial activity for Railways that took place in Buenos Aires from June 15th to 17th. Latinrieles is the most important forum in terms of transport carried out in Argentina, and it has the institutional support of important local organizations such as ALAF - Latin American Railroads Association, ACPF - Pan-American Railway Congress Association and ADIF – National Administration of Railway Infrastructure.

This edition of Latinrieles 2011 was focused on the projects undertaken by the government, and highlighted the renewed commitment to rebuild and improve the extension of railways in the country, not only in terms of infrastructure but also in terms of operations in Argentina.

Thus, Latinrieles, besides having the usual conferences given by operators, local and international companies, also offered a broad overview of market expectations. In general, LatinRieles 2011 provided an excellent atmosphere of optimism about the sector and to share projects, innovations and future plans.

During this event, ADIF presented its initiative for the reactivation and start up of the shell-work at La Plata plant, located in Buenos Aires province, with the cooperation of Vossloh. Within this frame, Vossloh South America and ADIF presented the main activities to be developed in this project, which would positively impact on the local market.

Vossloh South America also introduced new products as the locomotive CoCo Eurolight which, besides being the diesel-electric locomotive more powerful and agile in the world with 2800 hp and 15 tons per axle, is adapted to the Latin American market with its different possible paths.
